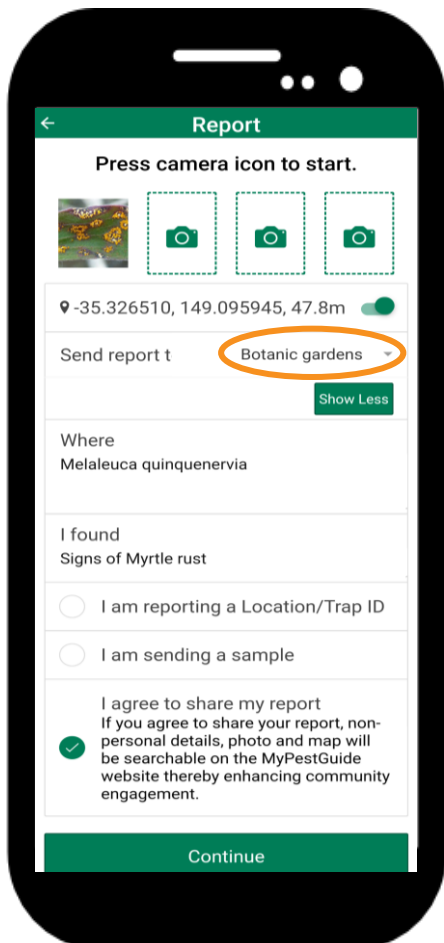
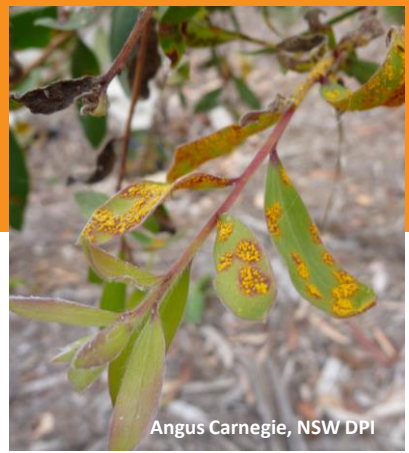


Myrtle rust blitz

12-20 September 2020

Myrtle rust is a disease caused by the fungus *Austropuccinia psidii* which affects more than 350 species in the Myrtaceae family. It was first identified in Australia in 2010 and is now widespread along Australia's eastern coast.

Between 5-11 September 2020 look for myrtle rust on up to five different plants belonging to the Myrtaceae family



Report what you find using the app

How to make a report

1. Upload up to 4 photos of the plant or symptoms
2. Turn on location
3. Select 'Botanic gardens' in the 'Send report to' field (click 'Show More' if it is not visible)
4. Report the genus and species of the plant in the 'Where' field
5. Report presence or absence of signs of myrtle rust in the 'I found' field
6. Press 'Continue' to submit your report
